HOW TO JOIN NCC

1.Enrolment into the National Cadet Corps is on a voluntary basis. Students, both boys and girls, can join at the age of 13 years in Junior Division (JD)/JuniorWing (JW) (Class VIII to X). Enrolment in Senior Division (SD)/Senior Wing (SW) is from Class XI to Class XII in Schools and also in degree colleges. A Cadet can stay in JD/JW for two years and in the SD/SW also for two years.

 Enrolment commences at the beginning of the academic Session immediately following the completion of the Institutional admission to the academic institutions.



NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)
AT A GLANCE

NATIONAL CADET

INSTITUTION

The National Cadet Corps has its genesis in the "University Corps" which was created under the Indian Defence Act · 1917 with the aim to make up the shortage of the Army. In 1920, when the Indian Territorial Act was passed, the University Corps was replaced by University Training Corps (UTC). In 1942, the University Training Corps was renamed as the University Officers Training Corps (UOTC). In order to create a youth organization at the national level, a Committee under Pandit HN Kunzru was set up in 1946. Recommendations of this Committee paved the way for the formation of NCC. Thus, the National Cadet Corps came Into existence under the National Cadet Corps Act XXXI of 1948 under the Ministry of Defence



AIMS OF NCC

To develop character, comradeship, discipline, leadership, secular outlook, spirit of adventure and the ideals of selfness service amongst the youth of the country.

To create a human resource of organized, trained and motivated youth, to provide leadership in all walks of life and always available for the service of the nation.

To provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces.



MOTTO

The motto of NCC is "Unity and Discipline".

GROWTH

The Corps which started in a small way with a cadet strength of 35 thousand has now grown to 13 lakhs and soon going to be 15 lakhs. The network of 774 NCC Units is spread all over the country through 4880 colleges and 7783 schools.

The National Cadet Corps was given an interservice image in 1950 when the Air Wing was added, followed by the Naval Wing in 1952. Earlier, in 1949, the girls' Division had been



brought in to give equal opportunity to school and college going girls of the nation. In 1952, the NCC curriculum was extended to include community development as part of the NCC syllabus.

ADVISORY COMMITTEES

There are two advisory committees. The Central Advisory Committee (CAC) is the highest policy making body at the National level. State Advisory Committee (SAC) is chaired by the Chief Ministers of the respective States.

ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURE

Headed by the Director General (DG), an Army Officer of the rank of Lt. General, the NCC has its HQ in Delhi. The DG is assisted by two Additional Directors General (ADG), one Major General from the Army and other a Rear Admiral form the Navy or an Air vice Marshal from the Air Force. At the State level, the country has been divided into 16 Directorates (Dtes) covering all States and Union Territories.

At the State level, the country has been divided into 17 Directorates (Dtes) covering all States and Union Territories. These Dtes are headed by an officer of the rank of Brigadier or its equivalent from the other two services. Each of the State NCC Dtes control varying number of Group Headquarters (Gp HQs), headed by an officer of the rank of colonel or its equivalent. An NCC Unit is commanded by a Lt. Col. or equivalent.

ACTIVITIES

The activities of NCC can be broadly divided into the following distinct categories described below:

INSTITUTIONAL TRAINING

Institutional training covers basic military training in the Army, Navy or Air Force subjects. The aim of this training is to expose the youth to a regimental way of

life and to inculcate in them the values a discipline, dutifulness, personality, orderliness, and smartness. Drill, shooting physical fitness, map reading, first-aid, gliding/powered

flying, boat pulling, sailing, and camp training form part of Institutional training. Camp training constitutes the

most important part of NCC Training. In camps, young cadets get the thrill and

joy of outdoor and community living. These camps widen the horizon of young cadets and provide them an opportunity to forge bonds of national brotherhood, bridging cultural and linguistic barriers.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES CUM SOCIAL SERVICE ACTIVITIES

Community development activities and social service programmes are aimed at imbibing amongst cadets selfless service to the community, dignity of labour, importance of self help, need to protect the environment and to assist weaker



sections of the society in their upliftment. This is done through programmes involving adult-education, tree plantation, blood donation, visit to Old Age Homes, slum clearance, village upliftment and various other social service schemes. Stress is now being laid on AIDS/HIV, Cancer ,awareness programmes and environmental programme specially in connection with reclaiming and developing wasteland and afforestation.

YOUTH EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES (YEP)

With a view to increasing international understanding and appreciation of socio-economic and cultural realities prevailing in each other's countries, the NCC has YEP with youth organisations/NCC of nine

BENEFITS FOR NCC

CADETS Defence Services

- a) Vacancies reserved for commission in the Defence for NCC "C" certified holders \div
 - (i) Army IMA Dehradun, 64 vacancies every year through UPSC and SSB interview. OTA Chennai, 100 vacancies every year for Short Service Commission (Non Tech), no UPSC exam, only SSB interview.
 - (ii) Navy · 6 vacancies per course. No UPSC exam, only SSB interview. Two years age relaxation for NCC "C" certificate holders.
 - (iii) Indian Air Force 10 % in all courses including flying training course. No UPSC exam, only SSB
- b) For ORs, Sailors, Airmen: 5 to 10% bonus marks awarded for recruitment.

c) Para Military Forces - 2 to 10 bonus marks awarded for recruitment.

YEP's include mutual visits of upto 20 cadets for a period of one week to three weeks. Proposal for extension of YEP with more countries viz USA, New Zealand, Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Myanmar is under progress.

ADVENTURE TRAINING AND SPORTS

Adventure activities and sports are organised to develop special qualities of courage, leadership, spirit of adventure and sportsmanship, spirit

of camaraderie, team work and self and confidence among the cadets. Some of the adventure activities are trekking, rock climbing, mountaineering, para jumping, seuba diving, water skiing, white water rafting, sailing, kayaking, yachting, hand gliding, para sailing, glider and microlight flying, slithering and cycle/motorcycle expeditions and

Hot air ballooning. In the field of sports NCC cadets participate in Subroto

football Cup, Jawahar Lal Nehru Hockey Championship and Mavalankar Shooting Championship.

REPUBLIC DAY CAMP

Every year during the month of January an All India Republic Day Camp is held at the Garrison Parade Ground, Delhi Cantonment. The camp is attended by 1800 boy & girl cadets drawn from all the States and Union

Territories, and by approx 80 cadets from friendly countries with whom the NCC is having Youth Exchange Programmes. The Vice President, the Prime Minister, the Raksha Mantri, the three service chiefs and many other national leader visit the NCC RD camp.







- d) **Department of Telecommunications** Bonus marks awarded for recruitment.
- e) NCC Civilian Gliding Instructors/Girl Cadet Instructors/Whole Time Lady Officers.
- f) \quad State Government Preference for State Services in certain states.

NCC SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME

Scholarship of Rs. 5000/- each per annum to 500 deserving NCC cadets who have excelled in academics. Award of Rs. 3,000/- each to the best cadets and Rs. 2,000/- each to the second best cadets in each group.

ANNUAL SAHARA SCHOLARSHIP

- a) Sahara Group of Companies have formulated a scheme for granting scholarship to cadets as under:-
 - (i) Rs. $5{,}000$ /- each for 368 cadets of Junior Division/Junior Wing (JD/JW).
